





Train at Matsuyama, a Beautiful Provincial City

Location: The Matsuyama City Hall is located at 132.46° east longitude, 33.50° north latitude. Its longitude is 7° off of Tokyo.

Geography: Occupies a large portion of the Dogo Plain, and faces the Seto Inland Sea to the west.

Climate: Mild and comfortable throughout the year, with clear skies and low amounts of precipitation. Relatively low incidents of

typhoons or any other natural hazards.

Characteristics: Matsuyama is the capital of Ehime Prefecture and has a population of 510,000. The largest city on the Shikoku Island.

its city center has an abundance of commercial facilities such as shopping centers and department stores, as well as an entertainment district comparable to those of mega cities.


Matsuyama Airport is very close to the city center (about a 15-minute car ride). The transportation system includes JR (Japan Railways) and other trains operated by private railways, as well as street cars. From the city center, the Dogo Onsen hot springs are only a 10 minutes away. It is a compact city with a concentration of urban functions and infrastructures, a culture-filled castle town that offers convenience, mild temperatures, and low risk of disasters.

The People of Matsuyama and Their Spirit of "Omotenashi"

Shikoku has a pilgrimage course called Shikoku henro ("Shikoku pilgrimage"), which involves visiting 88 temples on foot or by car. Eight of these temples are in Matsuyama City, which is more than any other city or town in Shikoku. Those traveling on this pilgrimage are called o-henro-san. Since the old days, residents of Matsuyama have given osettai, a practice of offering tangerines and tea to these o-henro-san as they pass by, a custom that is still widely and commonly performed in Matsuyama. the Matsuyama residents' natural and spontaneous habit of offering such omotenashi, a uniquely Japanese concept of offering wholehearted hospitality, may be due to the deep-rooted influence of the traditional custom of osettai.

Concentration of Major Medical Facilities and Emergency Services

Within Matsuyama City are general hospitals Ehime Prefectural Central Hospital and Matsuyama Red Cross Hospital. As their emergency medical service crew members work in shifts, athletes can focus on their training with a peace of mind.

Matsuyama City's Many Attractions! Historical Landscapes Integrated with Features of a Modern City

Matsuyama, Shikoku's largest city, is a small metropolis that's mellow and bright. A stylish modern capital built on the history of Dōgo Onsen, Japan's oldest hot spring resort, and of a castle town that has thrived since the Edo Period, it is a very convenient city with a perfect balance of the old and the new.



The Super Cool and Truly Authentic Japanese Castle Matsuyama Castle

Matsuyama Castle was built atop a 132-meter-high mountain in the middle of the city by KATŌ Yoshiaki, who was the first feudal lord of Matsuyama Castle. The construction began in 1602 and it took about a quarter of a century to complete. The castle keep that exists today was rebuilt in 1854 and is one of only 12 castle keeps in Japan that still remain. Its beautiful tall stone walls and carefully thought-out structure is remarkable and has won glowing accolades from castle enthusiasts. Of all the views from the castle, the one from the keep is especially stunning, commanding a 360-degree panorama.

Fun Shopping Experiences Ropeway Street, Ōkaidō, and Gintengai

The Ropeway Street at the foot of the Matsuyama Castle and main streets Ōkaidō and Gintengai are lined with many shops and are very lively. On both sides of the Ropeway Street are casual and welcoming cafes, restaurants that offer local specialties, and many souvenir shops. Ōkaidō and Gintengai are covered streets filled with boutiques offering the latest trends, and have major department stores at their ends. It is great fun simply strolling through and looking around.

The Wooden Three-Storied Buildings Create a Unique Atmosphere of a Hot-Spring Resort Dogo Onsen Honkan

Dōgo Onsen is a place of legends that have remained since the mythological era, and has been visited by many prominent figures and calligraphy artists since ancient times. Dōgo Onsen Honkan, which was renovated in 1894,

is a public bathhouse that is still in use and a National Important Cultural Property. Due to the many renovations it has undergone, it now has a labyrinthine interior.


As a way to pass on the Dōgo Onsen Honkan to future generations with great care, it is currently undergoing preservation and repair work, with the goal of reaching completion by the end of 2024. It is the first public bath in the country designated as an Important Cultural Property to continue operating while being renovated. Visitors can still take baths during this preservation and repair work, and we are calling on people to come and experience the charm that can only be able to enjoy during this time.

A Rattling Retro Train, Botchan Ressha

The train was modeled after the steam engine trains that ran through Matsuyama for many years since the Meiji period, which marked the beginning of Japan's modern era. The sight of this train rattling along in the city delights many visitors. Conductors in the same uniforms as those worn in the old days offer much hospitality to the riders.

Delicious Foods — Fruits of the Land and Sea and Brand-Name Meats

The mild climates of Matsuyama help produce a rich offering of cooking ingredients. A wide variety of fish can be caught in the Seto Inland Sea throughout the year, and many fresh vegetables grow in the Matsuyama Plain. Because there are also so many citrus fruits grown here, it is called the "Orange Kingdom." Enjoy eating and build stamina with the popular Ehime brand beef Ehime Akane Wagyū, Amatoro buta pork, and Himekko Jidori chicken.



Matsuyama Central Park


The city's largest sports facility located in southern Matsuyama. As it contains two baseball fields, Botchan Stadium (taken from the title of the famous novel that takes place in Matsuyama) and Madonna Stadium, as well as pools, a martial arts stadium, tennis courts, and a multipurpose athletic field, it is suitable for a wide range of sports events.

No-Ball Museum

Matsuyama City's baseball history and resource center located within the Botchan Stadium premise. ("No" in No-Ball means "field." The museum name is a play on the Japanese word for baseball, yakyū, which literally means "field ball.") In the section called "Ehime's Baseball" are a historical timeline of baseball in Ehime and a theater showing notable scenes from high school baseball. The "Professional Baseball" section contains an Ehime baseball hall-of-fame and records of all-star games.

Dreams that came true thanks to the strong wishes of baseball fans

On July 31, 2002, the second SANYO All-Star Game was held at the Botchan Stadium. All-Star Games feature dream teams that showcase players from the Central and Pacific Leagues selected by their fans. It was the first time this event took place in the Shikoku Region

Later, the second MAZDA All-Star Game was held on July 21, 2012, attracting many baseball fans from both within and outside of the prefecture.

Aqua Palette Matsuyama (Pools) 25

Facility with the latest water-saving design. Pools have environment-friendly features like efficient use of solar power, natural lighting, and energy-saving ventilation.

Pools include a 50-meter indoor pool with movable floors and walls that can create separated lanes, and a 25-meter outdoor pool.

Deai Field (Multipurpose Athletic Field)



The facility is called "Deai (pronounced de-ah-i) Field" and the bank (race tracks) is called "Seto-kazé Bank." The grounds have a spectator area that can seat about 5,000 people, as well as training camp facilities. Various types of events are held here including keirin (bicycle racing) and other bicycle competitions.

Lodging Facility

The Deai Field's lodging facility can accommodate up to 120 people, and it is complete with a dining room and communal baths. It is located within the Matsuyama Central Park and is within walking distance from the Botchan Stadium and other athletic facilities and therefore, it is often used for training camps for baseball and other sports. It should be noted that the lodging facility can only be used by those also using the facilities within Matsuyama Central Park.

Ehime Prefectural Budokan 🕏



Along with Nippon Budokan and Tokyo Budokan, this is the largest-scale martial arts arena in Japan. The main dojo that can accommodate as many as 8 competition mats (worth 1,024 tatami mats) equipped with the world's first "floating judo floor changing system" (automatically folds one mat (worth 128 tatami mats) at a time). The budokan also has a judo dojo (3 mats), kendo dojo (3 mats), auxiliary dojo (2 mats), training room, and a large, medium, and small meeting rooms. Many locally made materials were used in creating the building, including Kikuma-Gawara tiles, Ōshima-ishi rocks, and Tobeyaki pottery. It is a facility that has a uniquely Ehime-like air about it.





Matsuyama Multi-Purpose Community Center

Matsuyama Multi-Purpose Community Center is a facility complex in the urban area of Matsuyama City. The airy gymnasium contains such facilities as the main arena, sub-arena, training room, racquetball courts, as well as a heated pools with a lot of light.

Gymnasium

The main arena has the capacity to hold large-scale sports events, including games by professional basketball team Ehime Orange Vikings (B.League). The sub (auxiliary) arena can be used as the up court of the main area, or for holding smaller scale sports events.



Hojo Sports Center

Located in northern Matsuvama City on a hill with a beautiful view overlooking the Seto Inland Sea. The gymnasium has membrane roofing to let daylight in. In addition to the track and field stadium prepared with natural grass and ball game and futsal fields made with artificial turf, a long-awaited baseball field was opened in spring 2016.





The facility uses natural energies by employing membrane roofing for a part of its roof to allow natural light in, and promoting natural airflow for the entire arena through the ventilation windows installed on the sides of the building. Rainwater is efficiently utilized using the rainwater storage tank, and electricity is generated using a solar power generation system. On the first and second floors are terraces from which the beautiful views can be enjoyed.

Matsuyama Field Activity Center (Rainbow Highland)

Matsuyama Field Activity Center, popularly called "Rainbow Highland," is a facility complex comprised of three areas: "camp zone," "school zone," and "adventure zone." It boasts an area of some 45 hectare and capacity of lodging up to 920 people. Right by the lodging facility are a multipurpose ground with natural turf, tennis courts, and a gymnasium, making it suitable for various tournaments and training camps. There are also facilities that let you feel close to nature including an athletic field, open barbecue area, campfire area for rainy days, and outdoor classrooms.

Covered with natural turf, the ground can be used for various ball games such as soccer and rugby. The ground management building, completed in 2017, contains a multipurpose room, meeting rooms, and a training room.






